### INTRODUCTION TO READINGS: FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

**Second Reading:** 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 - Some members of the Corinthian community found it hard to accept Paul's teachings. They challenged his credentials and sincerity as an apostle because he was not an eyewitness to the earthly life of Jesus. In this passage, Paul defends his ministry as an apostle.
